What happens next?

1. You will receive a confirmation of receipt upon submission of your application. You may be sent a request for further information.
2. The Academic Director will review the application and folio and a recommendation made.
3. If accepted you will be emailed an Offer of Exchange which will outline the dates of the exchange, the terms and conditions and the subjects that you will be undertaking as part of the exchange. A list of materials you are required to have will be sent to you for your studies.
4. Information on overseas student health cover (OSHC) will also be sent. OSHC is a mandatory requirement for all students undertaking studies in Australia.
5. On acceptance of the offer, a CoE (Confirmation of Enrolment) will be issued to assist you with the student visa application with Department of Home Affairs (Immigration)
6. When your student visa is granted, email a copy to Whitehouse along with your arrival details.
7. If requested, we will meet you on arrival to settle you into your accommodation.
8. Exchange students should allow at least one week for orientation prior to commencement of studies.
